

## **CARLO COLLA & SONS MARIONETTE COMPANY**

In late eighteenth-century Milan, a wealthy businessman named Giovanbattista Colla dedicated a room of his home to a private puppet theater. Unsettled political times forced the family to leave Milan where they carved out a new life touring with their marionettes to villages across the Piedmont countryside. The earliest ledgers document the company's first performances on March 6, 1835. On 1861, upon Giovanbattista's death, his three sons divided up the marionettes, props, sets and scripts, and founded three separate companies. Carlo, the eldest, founded the one that will be known as Carlo Colla & Sons Marionette Company after the birth of his sons, Rosina, Carlo II, Giovanni and Michele. The company thrived throughout the 1800s, touring with great classics of European opera and drama. In 1911, the company took up permanent residence at Milan's Theatre Gerolamo, a theater built in 1868 with reduced dimensions specifically designed for marionettes, which meant that the audiences had a close view of the artistry that went into the puppets, their costumes and scenery.

In 1957 the Colla left the Gerolamo Theater and the Company remained inactive for several years. They resumed the activities in 1965 continuing the artistic tradition: Eugenio Monti Colla, artistic director of the Company until his death in November 2017, was the last puppeteer of the family still active among those who acted at the Teatro Gerolamo.

The Carlo Colla & Sons Marionette Company is one of the most recognized puppet theaters in the world, presenting nationally and internationally to audiences of adults and young people. Based in Milan, the company has toured five continents since 1980, participating in prestigious arts festivals in Edinburgh, Paris, Berlin, Sydney, Melbourne, Moscow, Charleston and Mexico City, among others. From 1980 till 1994 the Company has collaborated with the CRT Milan.

In 1984, the new generation of puppeteers, under the artistic direction of Eugenio Monti Colla, created the Associazione Grupporiani that, ever since, is producing all the activity of the Carlo Colla & Sons marionette Company. Since 2000, the company has collaborated with the Piccolo Teatro of Milan-Teatro d'Europa. The Company plays in Milan at the Piccolo Teatro, at Gerolamo Theater and at the Atelier Carlo Colla e Figli. In 2007, the company received accolades in the U.S. for their co-production of *Macbeth* with the Chicago Shakespeare Theater. In 2013 the Company presented *Sleeping Beauty* and in 2016 *The Pied Piper* at the New Victory Theater of New York

After the death of Eugenio Monti Colla, the new artistic director of the Carlo Colla & Sons marionette Company is Franco Citterio.
